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# About Us

*The Bridge* of *the Penn-York Valley Churches* is a non-profit organization of churches in the Penn-York Valley that serves the residents in the Waverly, Sayre, & Athens school districts. The aim of *The Bridge* is to bridge the gaps of life in the name of Jesus Christ and to help when and where other agencies are not able.

Specifically, the ministries of *The Bridge* in 2016 included offering voucher assistance for emergency needs especially housing related needs; catastrophic assistance; free furniture and household goods through *Helping Hands;* clothing, household goods, toys & books through the *Clothes Closet;* free clothing, hygiene items, school supplies & other assistance through *Kids at Risk;* food assistance through community meals and the *Mobile Food Pantry;* and referrals to other services through our *Clearinghouse.* 

*The Bridge* is supported by its member churches, individuals, The United Way, Waverly Community Chest, businesses, and community organizations. *The Bridge* generally holds two major fundraising events each year. One is the Sleepout held the Friday and Saturday after Thanksgiving. It is intended to bring awareness to those in need and to raise funds for the ministry. The other event is a Chicken Barbeque and Vintage Furniture Sale held in September. The Board of Directors of *The Bridge* meets monthly on the second Thursday of each month.

We are so very thankful for all those who participate in the ministry—donors and volunteers alike! We continue to seek God's direction as we serve in the ministry of *The Bridge*.

# 2016 Highlights

- **Charlie Hammond** awarded a brick at Sayre Theatre on 4/16/2016 honoring his over 20 years of service with *The Bridge's* Helping Hands ministry.
- Marsha Zwierlein also honored on 4/16/2016 with a brick for her over 25 years of service writing vouchers for *The Bridge* including writing the very first one!
- 14<sup>th</sup> Annual Sleepout was held in front of the Sayre Theatre November 25 & 25 raising awareness and over \$9,000.
- **Christmas Parade Float** was redesigned this year, the 18<sup>th</sup> year of participation.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Barbeque and Vintage Sale was held on Saturday, September 24 and raised over \$4,500.
- **Pastors'/Voucher Writers' Luncheon** was held at the North Waverly Chapel on March 8 to thank our pastors and voucher writers as well as to update them on the current ministry and to give them an opportunity to give feedback and interact.
- **Interim Assistance Pilot Program** was developed and approved for communication to member churches in December to solicit necessary volunteers and for implementation in late spring 2017. This assistance is aimed at assisting individuals or families who have experienced a significant event causing a short-term need that requires more than the regular assistance provides. It will be provided only once and given over a 3-6 month period of time. The Pilot was approved for 5 cases with an initial limit of \$1,500 each. The program requires partnership with a member church, goal setting, and interaction over the time of assistance.
- **Vouchers** Paid 325 vouchers for over \$80,000 to assist with electric (113), security deposit (73), rent (62), fuel (45), water/sewer (27), and other emergency needs (5) thereby helping 557 adults and 302 children.
- **Clothes Closet** Served 1,634 households giving out 21,540 free items of clothing & apparel, small housewares, books & toys. A volunteer picnic was held 8/25.
- **Helping Hands** Assisted 146 households with furniture appliances made possible by 253 donations.
- **Kids at Risk -** Served a total of 717 students in the school districts of Athens, Sayre, & Waverly with clothing, hygiene items, school supplies, and other needs anonymously by partnering with school personnel who identified needs and distributed items.
- **Community Dinners** Sponsored 4 of the weekly community dinners offered in the community.
- **Mobile Food Pantry** Distributed a total of 92,468 lbs. of food assisting 4,212 people: 1,013 children, 2,490 adults, and 709 elderly with an average of 154 households served each month. The monthly distribution moved from the Valley United Presbyterian Church, Waverly site, to the North Waverly Chapel in September.











The Clearinghouse is the access point for *The Bridge's* services. We respond to inquiries about *The Bridge* and its services as well as directing individuals seeking financial assistance or furniture to a local pastor or church to complete an application and receive a Bridge voucher if they are eligible. Family income, number of people in the household, household expenses, frequency of requests and residence (Sayre, Athens or Waverly school district) determine eligibility. Vouchers are used for rent/security deposit, utility shutoff, furniture and other emergency situations.

# **Voucher Writer Training**

*The Bridge* is dependent on voucher writers in our member churches to interview people requesting assistance. Three hundred thirty-three people were interviewed for cash assistance vouchers and 151 for furniture vouchers in 2016. Without trained voucher writers we would not have been able to assist these individuals and families.

Voucher writing training was provided to 3 individuals in 2016. This was needed as we lost an individual who had served as a



very active voucher writer. We are grateful for these new people and are thankful for the service of those who have and continue to serve the people of our community in this way.

### **Clothes Closet**



The Clothes Closet is a ministry of *The Bridge* located at the North Waverly Chapel which provides clothing and apparel, small household items, and toys to those in need without requiring a voucher and with no geographical restrictions. Individuals and families find out about the ministry through voucher writers, churches, friends, medical personnel, and the media. The ministry relies entirely upon donations from generous individuals and businesses in the community.





The addition of the donation chute last year to the Clothes Closet has continued to be a blessing as people can drop of donations in bags to us when it is convenient for them instead of being required to do it when we are open. The unintended effect has been that household and toy donations are down because they can't be put down the chute and they still need to come while we are open for those donations.

The Clothes Closet continued to operate twice a week,

Tuesdays from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm and Wednesdays from 12 noon to 2 pm serving those in need. In 2016, we had an average of 136 household contacts and distributed 1,795 items each month of the year for a grand total of 1,634 household contacts and 21,540 items distributed.

We are very thankful for all those who so generously donated items and for the numerous volunteers who make this ministry possible. We have 10 teams of 2-3 people each who work once a month while we are open as well as a number of people willing to be substitutes. We also have two teams which consistently work usually on Tuesday and Thursday mornings to restock and sort donations as well as a few people who work extra times when needed. A special thank you to **Marilyn Weber** who faithfully handled the data entry of clients served and items distributed this year as well as overseeing our work teams and assisting in other areas when needed.

As a way of honouring volunteers for their dedicated service, we held a picnic in the pavilion of the North Waverly Chapel on August 25. It was an enjoyable time.

So very thankful for all God is doing in and through us at the Clothes Closet.

# A Tribute to Charlie Hammond

August 26, 1929 - November 25, 2016

Charlie Hammond began with *The Bridge of Penn-York Valley Churches* over 20 years ago. He had retired from being the manager of Newberry's and his friends Renee and Jack Langan said to Charlie, "Why don't you come to a Board meeting?" and the rest, shall we say, is history.

When Charlie became the head of the Helping Hands Ministry, the ministry was in a small garage in Milan. He had a few guys who, when called upon, would come and help him pick up and deliver furniture. He organized, painted and made the space look neat and tidy. He had a place for everything.

I started working with Charlie 5 years ago. I was in awe of the man who was 82 at the time. The flood had just

happened and they were moving into the old Tioga Mills Warehouse. This building was as long as a football field. Charlie was there painting and sweeping getting it ready for all the furniture from the Valley Rally. His friends were there moving furniture and setting up shelving. Oh, the hours Charlie put in. He was dedicated to this ministry and to making sure that everything was set and ready to open to help all the families affected by the flood and those in need for other reasons.



Then we moved into the building where we are now—the old Quinlan's Park. It was in good shape when we moved in, but Charlie had us paint the floor. I remember him in his paint clothes trying to match colors, cans of paint all over. With Charlie everything had to be perfect. Lines were drawn on the floor by Charlie with a sharpie and a ruler, so that couches were all lined up just so. Shelving was put up and signs were made. How blessed we were to have Charlie make signs. They were perfection!! One of my husband's last memories of Charlie was toward the end, he couldn't lift much or move furniture so he was leaning on the bed of his truck, making signs for our Chicken BBQ. It was a beautiful scene—his white hair blowing

in the wind and a big smile on his face. He was doing what he loved.

Charlie was a man of deep faith. On the front license plate of his Lincoln Town Car was PS 138. *I will praise you Lord with all my heart*. Charlie was thankful for all God provided for him and his family.

Charlie did what he loved—helping others, telling stories, and celebrating the lives of the people he loved. Our ministry is grieving now at the loss of this wonderful man. Everywhere we look, we see him. His Helping Hands Ministry will continue; however, it will be without its 2 most important hands. We will carry on without you my friend, it will be hard and we miss you every day. Rest in God's peace.

# Kids at Risk



In 1994 the Kids at Risk ministry was started to meet the needs of children in the Sayre, Athens, and Waverly school districts. The main ministry focus is

helping children in uncomfortable or unhealthy situations that risk failure in school and possibly later in life from the lack of hygiene supplies, inadequate clothing and or school supplies. Kids at Risk

In 2016 Kids at Risk helped approximately 717 students. The counselors, school nurses, teachers and secretary's help make this program work. They take the time to evaluate a child's needs and then e-mail me with those needs. I check supplies on hand to see if I have those items, if not I purchase them.



Individuals, groups and churches in the community support Kids at Risk, and 100% of the donations go back into this ministry. I wish I could highlight every individual and group who has supported Kids at Risk throughout the year. I feel extremely grateful for each and every selfless donation. A few individuals that I would like to highlight for their work to keep Kids at Risk moving in the light of my sometimes difficult work schedule are Mary Rhodes, Cindy Jones, and Sally Harden. These three are always willing to run items to the schools for me, and I appreciate them all greatly!

# Mobile Food Pantry

*The Bridge* has continued to sponsor the Mobile Food Pantry each month on the third Wednesday of each month at 10a throughout 2016. Until September we were at the Waverly site of the Valley United Presbyterian Church where we have been for a number of years. Due to renovations being done at that location, the MFP moved back to the North Waverly Chapel where the distributions initially began back in 2008. The transition to the new location has been smooth. We provide an average of 25 volunteers for each distribution. Volunteers come from a variety of sources within *The Bridge* as well as a significant number of local homeschool families part of the Valley Area LEAH, a Christian homeschool group in the Valley.

There are a variety of jobs required including directing traffic/parking, signing in people, directing people, stocking the tables around the truck, bagging produce, handing out food, and helping people carry food to their vehicles. Many of the volunteers are "repeaters" meaning they



come every month which is a huge blessing and shows what a blessing it is for the volunteers as well. Like most of the ministries of *The Bridge*, it wouldn't be possible without dedicated volunteers!



We are especially grateful for the graciousness and hospitality of the Valley United Presbyterian Church and the North Waverly Chapel for allowing the distributions to take place on their property and for allowing us to use their indoor facilities. What a blessing!

In 2016, there were 12 distributions with an average of 154 households served with 7,705 lbs. food distributed each time. For the year, a total of 92,468 lbs. of food was distributed assisting 4,212 people: 1,013 children, 2,490 adults, and 709 elderly.

It has been a privilege to serve God and the people in this community through the ministry of the Mobile Food Pantry in 2016 along with co-coordinator Don Jayne and the many faithful volunteers.



Provided over \$80,000 in 324 vouchers for basic needs of rent (62), security deposit (73), fuel (45), electric (113), water/sewer (27), and other emergency needs (5) thereby helping 557 adults & 302 children.
